### 1. Warm-up Discussion Questions

1. Do you know how to ask for directions in English?
2. How do you usually ask for directions if you are lost?
3. Do you use maps on your phone to find directions?
4. How would you feel asking a stranger for directions in English?

## 2. Example Conversation: Asking for Directions

**Student A:** Excuse me! Can you help me, please?

**Student B:** Sure! How can I help you?

**Student A:** I'm looking for the train station. Do you know where it is?

**Student B:** Yes! Go straight down this street.

**Student A:** Okay. How far is it?

**Student B:** It's about five minutes from here.

**Student A:** Do I need to turn anywhere?

**Student B:** Yes, turn left at the traffic light.

**Student A:** After the traffic light?

**Student B:** Yes, after the traffic light, keep walking straight, and you will see the station.

**Student A:** Is it near any other buildings?

**Student B:** Yes, it's next to the big shopping mall. You can't miss it.

**Student A:** Thank you so much for your help!

**Student B:** You're welcome! Have a nice day!

**Student A:** Thanks! You too. Bye!

**Student B:** Goodbye!

### 3. Background

Student A is a visitor in a new city and is looking for directions to a specific location. They don't know the area well and decide to ask Student B, who lives in the city, for help.

### 4. Instructions

**Student A:**

You are visiting a new city. You need directions to the train station. Politely ask for directions and ask any follow-up questions to make sure you understand the way.

**Student B:**

You are a local resident. You know the area well. Help Student A by giving them clear directions to the train station. Answer any questions they may have to help them find their way.
