2. Example Conversation: Buying Groceries

Student A (Customer): Hello! Excuse me, where can I find apples?

Student B (Store Assistant): Hello! The apples are in aisle 3.

Student A: Yes, where can I find milk?

Student B: Milk is in the back, next to the eggs.

Student A: Thank you very much. I'll get two bottles of milk as well.

Student B: No problem. Please go to the checkout when you're ready.

(At the checkout)

Student A: Hello! I'd like to pay, please.

Student B (Cashier): Hello! That will be \$10. Would you like to pay with cash or card?

Student A: I'll pay with my card, please.

Student B: Thank you! Here's your receipt. Have a nice day!

Student A: Thank you! Goodbye!

Student B: Goodbye!
