2. Example Conversation: Talking About Your Family

Student B: Yes, we see them every month. They live close by.

Student A: That's nice. My grandparents live far away, so we don't see them much.

Student B: Families are all different, but they're special.

Student A: Yes, I agree. It was nice talking about our families!

Student B: Yes, it was! See you later!
