

Shopping for Clothes

CEFR A2 Roleplay



1. Warm-up Discussion

1. Where do you usually go shopping for clothes? Do you prefer online shopping or in-store shopping?
2. What are some important things to consider when buying clothes (e.g., size, color, price)?
3. How do you ask for a different size or color when shopping?
4. What do you say if you want to try something on?
5. Have you ever returned clothes to a store? What was the reason?
6. How do you ask if there are any discounts or sales in the store?

2. Example Conversation: Shopping for Clothes

Student A (Customer): Excuse me, do you have this shirt in a medium size?

Student B (Salesperson): Let me check... Yes, we have it in medium. Would you like to try it on?

Student A: Yes, please. Where are the fitting rooms?

Student B: The fitting rooms are at the back of the store, on the left.

Student A: Thank you. I'll try it on.

Student B: Sure! Let me know if you need any help.

(After trying on the shirt)

Student A: The shirt fits well, but do you have it in another color?

Student B: We have it in blue, black, and white. Which color do you prefer?

Student A: I think I'll go with the black one. How much is it?

Student B: It's \$30, but we have a 20% discount today.

Student A: That's great! I'll take the black shirt, please.

Student B: Would you like to pay by cash or card?

Student A: I'll pay by card. Thank you.

Student B: You're welcome. Have a nice day!

Student A: Thanks, you too!

3. Background

You are shopping for clothes at a store. One of you will be the customer looking for a specific item of clothing, and the other will be the salesperson helping them. The customer needs to find the right size, color, and possibly ask about prices or discounts. The salesperson will assist with finding the correct items and completing the purchase.

4. Instructions

- **Student A (Customer):** You are shopping for clothes and need help finding the right size, color, or style. Ask the salesperson for assistance, and make sure to try on the clothes before deciding to buy them.
- **Student B (Salesperson):** You are working in a clothing store. Help the customer find what they need, answer their questions, and assist them with trying on clothes. Be polite and helpful throughout the interaction.
